

Vaccine Appointment Instruction Guide

➤ FILL OUT COVID-19 VACCINE CONSENT FORM DAY BEFORE APPOINTMENT

Once you have a vaccine appointment, complete the online Consent Form

[<https://forms.myupdox.com/form/73497>] in its entirety the day before the appointment if possible.

Otherwise, the nurse will have you fill it out upon your arrival.

➤ ARRIVE FOR YOUR APPOINTMENT TIME, FOLLOW THE SIGNS AND PARK IN THE BACK OF THE BUILDING

There are designated parking spots located in the back of the Richichi Family Health office building [**1217 Piper Blvd, Naples FL 34110**]. Please arrive on time and follow the signs. There is a map included in this guide to help you.

➤ DURING YOUR APPOINTMENT

- Be prepared to wait 15 minutes after receiving the vaccine for observation.
- If you arrive early, please wait in your car until your appointment time.
- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth.
- You will get a vaccination card that tells you which COVID-19 vaccine you received, and when and where you received it.
- The nurse will tell you when to come back for your second appointment, if applicable.

➤ WHAT SHOULD YOU MENTION TO YOUR VACCINATION PROVIDER BEFORE YOU GET THE COVID-19 VACCINE?

Tell your vaccination provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- have any allergies
- have a fever
- have a bleeding disorder or are on a blood thinner
- are immunocompromised or are on a medicine that affects your immune system
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant
- are breastfeeding
- have received another COVID-19 vaccine

➤ WHAT ARE THE RISKS OF GETTING A COVID-19 VACCINE?

Side effects that have been reported with the COVID-19 Vaccine include:

- Injection site reactions: pain, tenderness and swelling of the lymph nodes in the same arm of the injection, swelling (hardness), and redness
- General side effects: fatigue, headache, muscle pain, joint pain, chills, nausea and vomiting, and fever
- There is a remote chance that the COVID-19 Vaccine could cause a severe allergic reaction. A severe allergic reaction would usually occur within a few minutes to one hour after getting a dose of the COVID-19 Vaccine. For this reason, your vaccination provider may ask you to stay at the place where you received your vaccine for monitoring after vaccination.
